

LEGEND

- A) Buildings are concentrated in the center of the site towards NIH and Old Georgetown Rd., away from residential areas.
- B) Building height is greatest along Old Georgetown Rd. and steps down closer to the residential edges.
- C) Physician offices are included in new patient-care wing, eliminating the need for a separate building.
- D) Landscape and building facades screen the visual impact of cars.
- E) Generous setbacks allow for significant landscaping, such as gardens and pathways, between the campus facilities and nearby residences and roadways.
- F) Primary mechanical equipment is housed within buildings to minimize visual impact and noise.
- G) Service areas and parking are screened from neighborhood view.
- H) Parking is concentrated in structured parking garage along Old Georgetown Rd.
- I) Closing of one block of Lincoln St. prevents hospital traffic from cutting through neighborhood.
- J) Separate entrances for emergency vehicles and patient/visitor traffic enhance pedestrian safety and campus circulation.
